Minister for Veterans' Affairs The Hon. Darren Chester launched the medallion and certificate on Wednesday in the lead up to the end of the Second World War commemoration on 15 August.

"As we approach this special anniversary, we recognise that it will be one of the last opportunities we have as a nation to publicly acknowledge the remaining veterans of the Second World War, of which there are around 12,000 still with us today," Mr Chester said.

Victory in the Pacific

What was the Victory in the Pacific?

On August 14, 1945, it was announced that Japan had surrendered unconditionally to the Allies, effectively ending World War II.

What does VP day mean to Australia? Victory in the Pacific **VP** Day. **VP** (Victory in the Pacific) **Day**, also referred to as **VJ** (Victory over Japan Day) is celebrated on 15 August. This date commemorates Japan's acceptance of the Allied demand for unconditional surrender 14 August 1945. For Australians, it **meant** that the Second World War was finally over.

RSL NSW is also seeking further guidance from the NSW Government to specifically assist with the conduct of commemoration services in the lead-up to VP Day, Vietnam Veterans Day and Remembrance Day. I will circulate this information as soon as it is available.

National VP Day Service

DVA have been in contact with RSL NSW to seek interest from any WWII veteran who would be interested in travelling to the Australian War Memorial for the national VP Day Service and a couple of associated events. DVA will cover the cost of travel and accommodation for interested veterans. If any sub-Branch has a WWII member who they feel is fit enough to attend this event over a couple of days, please contact the Support Unit with their details and we will try and facilitate their attendance.
